Morgantown history buffs: Milt Cohen's bicycle was/is being shown at the Morgantown History Museum. I have attached the photo from the Museum's newsletter, and the accompanying text below.

This bicycle is a Fuji Special Road Racer. For those of you who do not know, Milt was a well-known Morgantown community activist who rode his bicycle late into his 90's, and lived well into his 100's. I personally knew him since the 1970's. He participated on rides with the Monongalia Bicycle Club (bicycle advocacy and riding club). I served as co-editor of the newsletter for the club that we printed out with a ditto machine, what fun; most people probably do not remember or realize how good they have it these days with electronic newsletters, however, there is not necessarily a good reason to make major changes to the design of the bicycle, trust me that Fuji Special Road Racer, which Milt used, still gets the job done very well today!

Here is the text from the sheet on his bicycle: Milt Cohen's Bicycle

Milton Cohen was a Lawyer, Engineer, Retired Navy officer, Kiwanis Club member, worked with the Red Cross, was Chairman of Morgantown Parking Authority, organized the Downtown Action Council in the 1960's, and established the Downtown Merchants Organization. Milton's wife Bert was a historian and heavily involved in the local community and synagogue.

Milt was also known locally for riding his bicycle up one of the steepest streets in Morgantown and was throughout his life an avid bicyclist and bicycling enthusiast. (Jonathan Rosenbaum)

Robin's sister, Emily, has requested "lots of bikes" there.
