NEW: CRC's Spring Spectacular WEEKEND

CRC's premier event will be two full days this year, Saturday, April 30 – Sunday, May 1. On Saturday, April 30, meet in Mount Morris, PA, to enjoy a 25, 45, or 60 mile Road Ride on scenic, low traffic roads. New routes are being mapped, and will be reasonably hilly and challenging for fit road cyclists. The new \$15 registration fee includes coffee and snacks before the rides, map and cue sheet, and snack stop and SAG wagon support during the rides. Join us for a post-ride gathering at Sorella's Pizza, in Mount Morris.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>May 1</u>, <u>meet at the Wharf Street Parking Garage</u>, for either a leisurely 21 mile Rail-Trail ride, or a 60 mile Road Ride at moderate tempo with ~5,000 feet of climbing. Both Sunday rides will be free, with minimal support – please plan accordingly.

February CRC Board Meeting Notes

Your CRC Board of Directors met on February 10, 2016, in Fairmont, for a reporting and planning session. The Club started 2016 with a bank balance of \$2,425.86, and had \$1,980.62 on February 10. Discussions included: 2015 membership and financials; annual memberships with other non-profit organizations; website updates; the Spring Spectacular; Club insurance; the March-April ride schedule and newsletter; and the Harrison County rail-trail project. 2015 Annual Meeting Recap

Thirteen CRC members attended the Annual Meeting in Morgantown on October 24, 2015: Amanda, Bill, Bruce and Jennifer, Danny, Don and Jeanette, Gerry and Kelly, Lisa, Marilyn, Mary, and Phil.

Kelly, CRC President, opened the meeting by a review of the year's great activities. January started the year with the launch of our Facebook page (www.facebook.com/CRCyclists) and addition of two new membership types (approved at the 2014 Annual Meeting): Lifetime Individual, age 70+; and Lifetime Couple, age 70+. In February, planning for the Appalachian Spring Spectacular began. The Spring Pizza Party, first scheduled rides of the season (most of which were cancelled due to Snow!), and distribution of the League of American Bicyclists' "Smart Cycling Quick Guide" rounded out the month of March. In April, training for the Spring Spectacular Bonus Ride began, and several CRC members came out to support the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy Sojourn, held for the first time in West Virginia. May was a bustling month, with the Bonus Ride on May 2 (6 riders) and the Spring Spectacular on May 3 (79 riders), the first ride of the season on Snake Hill, the first Bike & Picnic of the season with Positive Spin (www.positivespin.org), and wrapping the month up with a big birthday bow was Lisa's 60 mile Mon River Trail ride (note: the birthday girl did an extra 4 miles!). In June, eight members went to Ohio for the Marietta River Rendezvous; five members pedaled through the WV RAVE in Cowen; 25 members enjoyed a sunny day picnicking at Prickett's Fort; and we placed our third annual Club jersey order, adding four new colors to our collection. To close out the season, September was fun-filled with 12 riders cycling through the Labor Day weekend 56 mile Rowlesburg Mountain Tour, our joint event with the MonBikeClub; eight members, including 10 year old Henry Knudsen, enjoying the second annual GAP Getaway Tour; six riders completed our Prosperity Century, including Chuck K., Frank, and Mike M. who all pedaled a full 100 miles (nicely done, gentlemen), and on behalf of the Club, Kelly wrote to the WV Commissioner for Highways, Paul Maddox, to request repaving of Rt. 100 in Mon County.

Mary, CRC Secretary/Treasurer, reported on membership and finances (updated 12/31/15 data is listed here). Membership: 128 Club Members distributed into 97 Club Memberships comprised of a) 67 Renewals + 30 New, and b) 71 Individual, 1 Lifetime Individual, 2 Lifetime. Finances: The Club started the year with \$2,194.34 and closed with \$2,425.86, for a net gain of \$231.52. We received donations of \$200: \$20 from members in excess of dues; and \$180 from members and friends toward the joint CRC/Team RWB Military Care Packages project. We distributed donations of \$650.80: \$160 to the Mon River Trail Conservancy (\$100 toward Decker's Creek Rock Forge wash-out repairs (approved at the 2014 Annual Meeting), \$60 from Spring Spectacular proceeds); \$300 from Spring Spectacular proceeds to HelpHopeLive (helphopelive.org) toward member John Bowders' medical expenses and specialized equipment; and \$190.80 for CRC/Team RWB Military Care Packages postage.

Kelly noted that the Club will have offered 78 organized rides by the end of October, and expressed gratitude to all the 2015 ride leaders.

Following nominations, three officers were elected: Kelly Williams, President; Amanda Bise, VP/Ride Captain; and Mary Small, Secretary/Treasurer.

Prosperity Century Report

The September 21, 2015 Prosperity Century was probably one of the nicest and easiest because the weather was perfect: cool and mostly sunny. Starting at the Mon County Courthouse at 9:00 am, the same time as the regular MonBikeClub (MBC), might have caused some confusion. 6 cyclists: Kelly, Mike, Frank, Fran, Daveed and Michelle showed up. Impressive that Daveed and Michelle showed up since the day before, Daveed rode 75-miles and climbed 7,000-feet on the Kean Bird Memorial Ride.

Unlike most CRC rides that always start on the dot, this one departed at 9:15, another MBC tradition. As the group slowly rolled out through Westover, it became apparent that Mike and Frank were the only members intending to ride all the way to Prosperity so they rode ahead and met Chuck, who had ridden down from Prosperity, near Maidsville. Surprisingly, at Lazelle Union hill, Daveed and Michelle zoomed past, up and over the hill not to be seen again. Who knows where Kelly and Fran went?

Mike, Chuck, and Frank deviated somewhat from the traditional Prosperity Century route. They threw in an extra little climb up and over Mason Ridge from Rt. 19 to the Kirby Road. Then, Chuck rode up and over the interstate overpass to check if any CRC members were joining the ride from there, another CRC tradition. Nobody was there. Instead of going over to the Garards Fort / Fordyce Road and up to Waynesburg that way, they decided from Kirby Rd. to take Lemley Road to Rt. 19 and up to Waynesburg that way.

In Waynesburg, they stopped at Sheetz for very good sandwiches, chips, pastries and coffee and good chatter about the benefits of caffeine and roasting your own beans.

As in the past 2-3 years, instead of continuing on Rt. 18 into Prosperity, they turned right in Neneveh and onto some secluded gorgeous mostly paved one-lane roads on which only Chuck could lead and ended up in Prosperity. Despite it being his 14th Wedding Anniversary, rather than going straight home, Chuck sat with Mike and Frank on the porch of Jim's store while they are a sandwich and other goodies, and chatted with various customers including a coal miner and a brick & stone mason.
